**HOMELESSNESS SERVICES AND AFFORDABLE HOUSING TRANSACTIONS AND USE TAX ORDINANCE.**

To fund homelessness programs, including mental health care, substance abuse treatment, affordable housing, rental subsidies, job counseling, and services for vulnerable populations including homeless families, veterans, abused women, seniors, and disabled persons; shall a measure repealing a 1/4 percent sales tax and replacing it with a 1/2 percent sales tax providing approximately \$1.2 billion annually, with audits, citizens' oversight, until ended by voters, be adopted?
